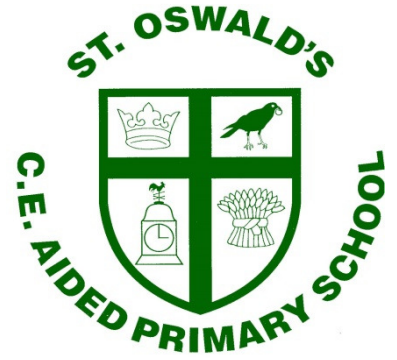


## Pupil Premium Statement 2013-2014



The Pupil Premium for 2013 to 2014 is allocated to local authorities and schools with pupils on roll in January 2012 that are known to have been eligible for free school meals (FSM) at any time in the last 6 years. Each of these pupils will attract £900. This is the same amount of money for Looked After Children and for Service Children the school receives £200 per child.

Schools will have the freedom to spend the Premium, which is additional to the underlying schools budget, in a way they think will best support the raising of attainment for the most vulnerable pupils.

The total allocation for St Oswald's CE Primary School for 2013-2014 was £8751

St Oswald's CE Primary School receives a Pupil Premium Grant for each child who is entitled to receive Free School Meals\* (FSM), Children in Care (CiC) and Service children.

\*from 2012, pupils are classed as FSM if they have been eligible for and claiming FSM at any time in the last 6 years

We are required to publish online information about how we have used the premium. This year, the funding received from Pupil Premium has been allocated in the following ways:

- Supporting learning through programmes delivered to individual or small groups for those children who need a boost to their learning in order to reach their potential, or who require 'gaps' to be closed in their learning. For example: small group reading, writing or mathematics tuition, passion for learning.
- Subsidising residential visits
- Providing specific training and resources for staff to use, e.g. makaton
- Ensuring that children have their needs clearly identified and their progress is closely monitored through the school
- Additional staffing to support specific children
